

Connecticut Cool Choice: HVAC Rebate

The Connecticut Cool Choice Rebate Program is designed to encourage premium efficient upgrades for new and replacement HVAC equipment in Commercial and Industrial (C/I) facilities. The purpose is to provide an easy and convenient process to rebate installed qualifying HVAC units. An immediate reduction of load can be realized during 2007 without delay.

Connecticut Cool Choice HVAC Rebate Structure:

- Rebate will be:
 - Based on \$\$ per ton (12,000 btuh's) of HVAC equipment.
 - Rebates range from \$70 to \$100 per ton for Tier One qualifying equipment
 - Rebates range from \$120 to \$200 per ton for Tier Two qualifying equipment
 - \$250 per dual enthalpy economizer control installed.

Connecticut Cool Choice HVAC Rebate Guidelines:

- Equipment must be purchased and installed on or after January 1, 2007.
- Form must be submitted by December 31, 2007.
- C/I electric service customers of CL&P/UI for existing facilities are eligible.
- Qualifying HVAC equipment units may be a new installation, or replacing a failed unit.
- Qualifying efficiency (EER/SEER/HSPF) requirements (which varies depending on equipment size) are listed on rebate form. Manufacturer's specification sheets documenting the efficiency rating of the new equipment is required.
- Dual Enthalpy Economizer Controls will be eligible for a rebate when installed on new qualifying HVAC equipment. Dual Enthalpy Economizer Controls may be factory installed or contractor installed. If applicable, Dual Enthalpy Economizer Controls must be listed on the customer invoice.
- Detailed invoices stating manufacturer, model number, qualifying accessories and quantities will determine rebate levels.
- Customers must supply a completed and signed W-9 listing their tax-id number. An IRS form 1099 will be generated for rebates in excess of \$600.
- Payment will be issued by check or credit to electric account within 60 days of submittal.
- Pre-approval is required for rebates exceeding \$5,000 by an authorized CL&P/UI representative.
- Qualifying HVAC equipment can be up to 30 tons in size. HVAC equipment greater than 30 tons may be eligible for incentives through UI's and CL&P's Energy Conscious Blueprint program. See your UI or CL&P representative for additional information.
