The following guidance is to the Environmental Justice Mapping Tool for Connecticut.

To use this tool, follow these steps:

- Go to <u>ArcGIS Web Application</u> or <u>ArcGIS</u> and sign in with your account. If you do not have an account, you can create a free, public account here. (optional)
- Click on **Map** to open a new, blank map in the ArcGIS Online Map Viewer. You can also open an existing map and save it to your account.
- To add data layers to your map, click on **Add** and choose from the options. You can search for data from the web, upload your own files, or connect to map and image services.
- To connect to map and image services in Connecticut, you can use the <u>Connecticut</u> <u>Environmental Conditions Online (CT ECO)</u> website. CT ECO provides access to various geospatial data sets for Connecticut, such as lidar, land cover, soils, and more. You can find the service URLs on the CT ECO website and copy and paste them into the ArcGIS Online Map Viewer.
- To customize your map, you can use the tools on the toolbar, such as zoom, measure, draw, filter, and more. You can also change the base map, adjust the transparency, and reorder the layers.
- To save and share your map, click on **Save** and enter a title, tags, and summary. You can also choose who can view your map, such as everyone, your organization, or specific groups. You can also share your map via email, social media, or embed it in a website.
